Environmental & Social Impact Assessment for Liberia Electricity Corporation
Proposed 66 kV Power Electric Transmission Line Project

The Government of Liberia is working with the European Union under the Monrovia Consolidation of Electricity Transmission and Distribution Project to improve the operation and reliability of the T & D Power System of Liberia and to increase the access to electricity in and around Monrovia. The project has two key components:

1. Greater Monrovia Transmission Reinforcement – support for the reinforcement needed in 66 kV transmission network till 2030;
2. Distribution extension at 22 kV and Consumer Connection 0.4 kV - support for the connection of a total of 58,180 customers and 23 large consumers with an approximated total power 18,050 kVA.

The general public and all concerned or interested parties are hereby informed that Liberia Electricity Corporation (LEC) (the Applicant) has commissioned TSC Engineering and Construction Consultant to prepare an Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) for the above mentioned components.
